#### **School/Home Communication**

Conscientious use of this plan book will provide a daily update of assignments and grades.

### **Sapphire**

Sapphire is the district's student information system (SIS). On the first page of the student agenda book are directions on how to access the Sapphire Community Web Portal. From the portal, you can see student grades, attendance, discipline, and schedule. If you have already created an account and you don't remember your PIN number, you will have to contact the technology department at 824-3400, ext. 4111. Checking your child's progress is an excellent way to be involved with the school and your child's education.


