**JANUARY 15, 2018** 

The Wattsburg Area School District Board of Education held their Regular Board meeting at the Wattsburg Area Elementary Center on January 15, 2018. President Andy Pushchak called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

**School Reports** 

During the school reports, Mr. Miller introduced Officer Knight and Mrs. Manino who shared the Community Knights Program at Seneca. The program targets students who are not involved in other school activities and emphasizes being bully free, drug free, and stress free. There are about 35 students who participate regularly in the program.

Serena Spencer, Hannah Brigley and Ally Brooks, members of the middle school Robotics Team, shared their experiences of the robotics competition held at Penn State Behrend. The middle school had two teams that participated in the competition. The team placed 1<sup>st</sup> for core values and 5<sup>th</sup> (out of 47) in robotics. Mr. Semrau is the advisor for the Robotics Team.

Mr. Calabrese introduced Cheyanne Brown. Cheyanne is the WQLN Reading Competition winner this year. During a three-month period, Cheyanne read 980 books. School wide, the elementary center students read 5,417 books. Cheyanne received a trophy, books and a Kindle Fire. The WAEC Library received \$250 for new books.

Mr. Berlin thanked all the students for representing the district so positively.

Mr. Berlin updated the Board on Senate Bill 2 (SB2), which may be moved out of committee to the floor for a vote. The bill would provide a \$5,700 voucher at the expense of public schools to subsidize private school tuition. This could take much-needed funds from the district if it becomes law. Mr. Berlin said he would provide a draft resolution opposing SB2 for the Board to consider at the February board meeting
